


The Rabbit





CHURCH NEWS

Although Christmas is always on the 25 December, Easter is a celebration without a fixed date. We celebrate Easter on the first Sunday in spring after full moon. To be honest for those living in the northern hemisphere this is a wonderful time to celebrate the resurrection of Christ. It is a time nature renewed itself. Crocuses and daffodils start to colour the gardens, birds flying around with their beaks full of twigs for the building of their nests, the buds are growing on trees and bushes, the first lambs appear in the fields. With Easter we celebrate that Christ rose again from the death. There is hope after brokenness, life after death. Maybe this is a difficult concept to understand. However when we look around us and may witness year after year the miracle that nature come alive again after a cold winter where nothing grows, we see the Easter story unfolding in front of our eyes.

PRESS RELEASE

A Portrait of the River by Mel Shand

Local artist and photographer Mel Shand has been busy again and can now add author to her CV. To celebrate 150 years of the River Dee Board, she was commissioned to produce a beautiful book that showcases the people whose life revolves around the River Dee. The book features 71 people who work on and around the Dee, including 50 ghillies.

Mel spent over a year travelling the length of the River Dee, from the source at the Linn of Dee to Aberdeen Harbour where it meets the sea. Along the way she interviewed and photographed every ghillie and some of the riparian owners, shopkeepers and river staff including the harbour master. The book contains some extremely interesting and entertaining anecdotes, as well as stunning photography of the people and their river.

In the spirit of *A Portrait of our Time* (Poot) Mel's aim was once again to capture the heart and soul of the people in a celebration of rural life and work.

The book will be published in April, signed copies can be ordered at a cost of £20 + p&p by emailing melshand.artist@gmail.com. Proceeds from the sale will go to support the work of the River Dee Trust.
